## DAIRY RULES & REGULATIONS

**BE SURE TO READ RULES & REGULATIONS AT BEGINNING OF EACH SECTION.**

1. Syndicates, groups or partnerships will be respected as separate, individual exhibitors.
2. Entry Fee: A 20% entry fee will be deducted from prize money for classes 6 to 12.
3. 1 Exhibitor Pass per head (maximum 4) will be given to each exhibitor, additional passes may be purchased. This pass does not include access to rides.
4. Cattle classes will be shown as scheduled and exhibitors are requested to have their cattle on the grounds by Friday, August 10 at 6:00 pm.
5. All animals must be registered at time of making entries. The name, registration number, date of birth (year/month/day), name and registration number of sire and dam are also required. B.C.A. is not required but will be used in the program.
6. Exhibitors must have registration certificates and production records on hand and produce them when requested by an official. (No photocopies or copies of sale catalogues will be accepted as proof of performance.)
7. All exhibits must be registered in the name of the exhibitor in accordance with the by-law of their respective association. The certificate of registration must state that the animal is purebred or at least 75% of purebred inheritance. All exhibits must be legibly tattooed (if applicable).
8. There must be at least 3 exhibitors in each breed of dairy classifications. If less than 3 exhibitors in one of the following breeds: Holstein, Ayrshire and Jersey, also less than 24 per breed, only 50% of the prizes offered will be paid that breed by this exhibition.
9. **HEALTH REGULATIONS:** All animals offered for entry must be free from contact with any contagious or infectious disease for a period of 60 days prior to the opening of the Fair.
10. **ENTRIES CLOSE FRIDAY, AUGUST 3<sup>rd</sup> AT 12h00 NOON.** Entries after this date will be accepted only if space available.

11. **Verification of animals will take place Friday August 10 between 6:00 p.m. and 9:00 p.m.** All exhibitors are asked to have someone present with their animals with registration certificates and production certificates during this time.
12. **Animals may leave on Saturday at 18h00.** HAS offers \$10/head, maximum \$50/exhibitor who stays until 15h00 on Sunday.
13. All competitors are subject to the Society's Dairy Rules & Regulations and when doubts or disputes arise, the Board of Directors shall decide the same.
14. All judges have been carefully selected and persons making entries accept these judges and agree to abide by their decisions. The judge has the privilege of withholding a first prize in any class where he/she feels there is no article qualified to receive a first prize. Protests or other grounds must be made in writing on the day in which protested action was taken, given to the chairperson of the department and accompanied by a non-refundable cash deposit of \$50.00 .
15. The Society will take reasonable precaution to ensure the safety of all exhibits on exhibition, but the owners themselves must take the risk of exhibiting them.
16. Exhibitors must supply their own hay, bedding or grain. All exhibitors must be responsible for their own exhibits.
17. The Directors reserve the right to pay prizes according to the money available. Specials are in addition to prize money.
18. There will be absolutely no replacement of voided cheques. All cheques must be cashed within 30 days of issuance. This rule will be strictly adhered to. All prize money will be paid in Canadian Funds.
19. No animal having a contagious disease shall be allowed on the exhibition grounds, and if any animal has been admitted through an oversight, and is suffering from any such disease, the executive committee shall immediately order its removal from the grounds and cause the stall to be disinfected.
20. **SMOKING IS ABSOLUTELY FORBIDDEN IN ALL BUILDINGS** and it is forbidden to connect heaters, floodlights, etc. to the electric circuits in the barns.
21. No dog or other vicious animal will be allowed on the grounds unless forming part of an entertainment group and is under the constant care of its keeper.
22. The Directors reserve the right to amend or change these rules in any way they see fit.
23. The Society will not hold itself responsible for any grammatical, typographical or printing errors in the prize list. Should they occur, the Directors shall rule on them.

**\*\*In virtue of Federal and Provincial cattle identification rules, animals without electronic identification will not be accepted on site.**

**Class 7 – Female Summer Yearling, born June 1/17 – Aug. 31/17**

**Class 8 – Female, 1-year old Junior Yearling, born March 1/17 – May 31/17**

**Class 9 – Female, 1-year old Intermediate Yearling, born Dec. 1/16 - Feb 28/ 17**

**Class 10– Female, 1-year old Senior Yearling, born Sept. 1/16 - Nov 30/16**

**Class 11- Progeny of Dame- (2 female offspring of a common mother)**

**Class 12 - Junior Breeders Herd (owned & bred by exhibitor).** Group of 3 animals, limited to one exhibit per Exhibitor. Exhibitor must have bred all three animals and own at least two. The registration certificate for each respective animal must show the exhibitor as “breeder” and as “owner” in both cases either as an individual or in partnership. In other words, the exhibitor may be a “joint owner/joint breeder” of an animal. Note the exception: where another exhibitor may own one animal.

**NUMBER OF EXHIBITS PER BREEDING UNIT**

The maximum total eligible exhibits from a breeding unit is 15 head, comprised of 10 head plus 2 4-H calves and 2 subs (4-H animals must be shown by 4-H members). These exhibits will not be eligible to compete in the Breeders Herd. Prize money will be paid out for the top 10 head only. A Banner will be given to the best 5 animals.

## JUNIOR FARMER DIVISION RULES

The Canada Department of Agriculture supports the Junior Farmer Division with the aim of:

- a) Encouraging organized boys and girls club work in the district
- b) To improve the educational value of the Fair
- c) To develop better farmers and breeders
- d) To stimulate the interest of young people in the Fair, through them to interest a greater number of adults.

The exhibition is open to all boys and girls who are members of Calf Clubs or Junior Farmers Clubs organized under the auspices of the Federal and Provincial Department of Agriculture.

### **RULES & REGULATIONS:**

1. **HEALTH RULES:** Refer to Dairy Cattle regulation #9 when registering.
2. In order to take part in the competition, contestants must be between the ages of 9 and 21 (Proof of age required) as of 01/01/2018.
3. **ENTRIES CLOSE FRIDAY, AUGUST 3, 2018 at 12H00 NOON. Entries after this date will be charged \$10.00 per head. NO ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED FRIDAY, AUGUST 10, 2018.**  
Entries must include birth date, full name of contestant and calf plus a photocopy of the Pedigree and metal ear tag number are required
4. All club exhibits must be on the Fair Grounds by 18h00 on Friday, August 10, 2018.
5. Inter-Club show will take place on Saturday August 11, 2018, see schedule below.
6. No reference material of any kind will be permitted by any contestant while judging classes are in progress.
7. Each contestant must be dressed in white to exhibit calf.
8. In showmanship classes, each contestant must use his/her own calf to show in calf classes.
9. **All 4-H members who register before August 3 will receive an exhibitor's pass and also, after showing your calf in class, each member will receive a one (1) day pass for the rides.**
